Dr. Barkley received his Ph.D. in 1977 in Clinical Psychology from Bowling Green State University. He is currently a Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the Medical University of South Carolina and also Research Professor of Psychiatry at the State University of New York Upstate Medical University in Syracuse.

Dr. Barkley is a Diplomate in Clinical Psychology (ABPP) Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology and Clinical Neuropsychology (ABCN, ABPP). He is a clinical scientist, educator, and practitioner who has authored, co-authored and published numerous books, clinical manuals, texts, scientific papers and book chapters related to ADHD.

Dr. Barkley is also the founder and editor of *The ADHD Report* (Guilford), a newsletter for clinical professionals.

He has received numerous awards for his research career in child development and psychopathology and efforts to educate the public and other professionals about the science of ADHD.

Dr. Barkley has presented more than 700 invited workshops, public addresses and scientific presentations in the U.S. and across the world. He has also appeared on numerous TV programs including *60 Minutes*, the *Today Show*, *Good Morning America*, and *CNN Sunday Morning*. He presented for J&K Seminars in 1999, 2002, & 2004.
